7	AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 2 ("ADMINISTRATION") OF THE CODE
8	OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF COLLEGE PARK, GEORGIA, BY ADDING A NEW
9	ARTICLE VII ("CITY COURT JUDGES") AND ADDING NEW SECTION 2-105 ("CHIEF
LO	CITY COURT JUDGE") AND SECTION 2-106 ("PRO TEM CITY COURT JUDGE"); TO
l1	PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; TO
12	PROVIDE AN ADOPTION DATE; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND TO
L3	PROVIDE FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES.
L4	WHEREAS, the duly elected governing authority of the City of College Park, Georgia
15	(hereinafter the "City") is the Mayor and Council thereof; and
L6	WHEREAS, the governing authority desires to amend its Code of Ordinances to comply
L7	with state law; and
18	WHEREAS, the governing authority of the City determines that compliance with state
19	law will provide for the health, safety, and welfare of the inhabitants of the City;
20 21	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLLEGE PARK, GEORGIA THAT:
22 23	Section One. Chapter 2 ("Administration"), of the Code of Ordinances, City of College
24	Park, Georgia is hereby amended by adding a new Article VII to be entitled "City Court Judges"
25	and by adding a new Section 2-105, to be entitled "Chief City Court Judge", to read and to be
26	codified as follows:

29	"Sec.2-105. – Chief City Court Judge		
30 31 32 33 34	The mayor and council may appoint an individual to serve as chief judge to preside over the city's municipal court. The chief judge shall be responsible for the general supervision of the city court and shall promulgate all rules necessary for the supervision, conduct, and administration of the court."		
35	Section Two. Chapter 2 ("Administration"), of the Code of Ordinances, City of College		
36	Park, Georgia is hereby amended by adding a new Article VII to be entitled "City Court Judges"		
37	and by adding a new Section 2-106, to be entitled "City Court Judge Pro Tem", to read and to be		
38	codified as follows:		
39	"Sec. 2-106 City Court Judge Pro Tem		
40 41 42 43	The mayor and council may appoint a city court judge pro tem, who shall be acting city court judge in the absence, disability or disqualification of the chief city court judge. The acting city court judge shall have all the powers and perform all the duties of the chief municipal court judge when necessary."		
44	Section Three. The preamble of this Ordinance shall be considered to be and is hereby		
45	incorporated by reference as if fully set out herein.		
46	Section Four. This Ordinance shall be codified in a manner consistent with the laws of		
47	the State of Georgia and the City.		
48	Section Five (a) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that		
49	all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are or were, upon their		
50	enactment, believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.		
51	(b) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest		
52	extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this		
53	Ordinance is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this		
54	Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the		
55	greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this		

56	Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase			
57	of this Ordinance.			
58	(c) In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance			
59	shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise			
60	unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the			
61	express intent of the Mayor and Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or			
62	unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional			
63	or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or			
64	sections of the Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining phrases,			
65	clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional			
66	enforceable, and of full force and effect.			
67	Section Six. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby			
68	expressly repealed.			
69	Section Seven. The effective date of this Ordinance shall be the date of adoption unless			
70	otherwise stated herein.
